

Alumni Board Elections





Later, she took classes at Moody and met her husband **Paul '43** there in 1943. They married in Kano, Nigeria, where they served as missionaries from 1944 to 1959.

Upon returning to the States, Anne took care of her three girls and served as the child evangelism director at the church Paul pastored at in Indiana.

Paul served as the pastor of a number of churches throughout his life until he retired in 1985. His last years of service were at Sunbury Evangelical

Congregational Church. However, he often helped the pastor at Christ Community United Methodist Church in Selinsgrove, PA, during his retirement years.

Whenever Anne lived in Pennsylvania, she served as a nurse. She worked at Sunbury Community Hospital in Pennsylvania for 15 years and retired at about the same time Paul did.

She was preceded in death by Paul (he died at the age of 84 on March 20, 2004); two brothers, William and Oscar; and three sisters, Mary, Helen, and Ruth. Anne is survived by three daughters, **Rachel (Swartz '64-'66) Reynolds, Lois (Swartz '72) Scanlon**, and **Ruth (Swartz '76-'77) Kann**; son-in-law **Arnold Reynolds '68**, and seven grandchildren; and 11 great-grandchildren.

Russell Allen Bowren '42, May 17, 2009, age 91, Normal, IL.

Russell was born in Pontiac, MI, in 1918. After attending Moody, he earned a bachelor's degree from Bob Jones University and a master's from the University of New Mexico.

He married Fay Herrmann in 1946 in Oklahoma City, and that same year Russell began his service as a Southern

Baptist Missionary to the Navajo Indians of New Mexico. He organized the first Navajo Baptist church at the Alamo Reservation.

In 1952, Russell and Fay moved to Gallup, NM, and established the Gallup Baptist Indian Center. The center ministered to Indians of various tribes and soon after became a church as well. Russell pioneered most of the Southern Baptist Navajo Mission points between Window Rock, AZ, and Albuquerque, NM. Today these mission points are led by Navajo pastors.

In 1960, he resigned from his position of SBC missionary and spent five years working as the guidance counselor at Zuni High School on the Zuni Pueblo Reservation.

Nine years later, the Bowren family moved to Normal, IL, where his wife became the professor of education at Illinois State University, and Russell continued to work as a guidance counselor in schools. Later he was transferred from an elementary school to a developmental center where he was an educator of mentally and physically challenged adults.

Russell retired in 1991 but continued ministering at several of the Bloomington/Normal nursing homes and serving with the Gideons International and Vale Community Church.

Russell is survived by his wife Fay; three daughters: Joy Sorden, Linda King, and Diana Bricker; one son, Tim Bowren; five grandchildren; and eight great-grandchildren.

Hubert "Herb" D. Reynhout Jr. '34, August 12, 2009, age 99, Matthews, NC.

Herb was born, the eldest of four, in Grand Rapids, MI. He attended junior college and Calvin College, where he graduated in 1932.

Then Herb and his new wife **Doris (Rogers '34)** went to Moody where they prepared to be missionaries. After receiving his diploma from Moody, Herb pastored a small church in Michigan for three years. This helped prepare him for mission work.

In 1936, Herb, Doris, and their daughter Ruth sailed to India, where they served for the next nine years. During that time, Herb worked with the Muslims of south India and Doris gave birth to five more children—the youngest ones being triplets.

The Reynhouts moved back to the States in 1945, spending the next two years in Grand Rapids and then the next 30 years in North Kingstown, RI. Herb taught at Providence Bible Institute and then went to Harvard University to earn his Ed.D. He was the Dean of Men at Harvard and also taught a variety of classes there.

Herb retired in 1976 and moved with Doris to East Douglas, MA. Herb spent his time there gardening, golfing, and serving as an interim pastor. About 15 years later, Herb and Doris settled into North Carolina where their daughter Ruth lived.

Faculty

Robert C. Carbaugh, July 7, 2009, age 93, Arlington Heights, IL.

Robert served at Moody for 27 years as music professor and conductor. An accomplished musician, he founded the Women's Glee Club in 1955 and the Men's Glee Club in 1957. He also pioneered one of the first handbell choirs in America, conducted the first oratorio chorus at Moody, and conceived the Candlelight Carols program, which continues to this day. These accomplishments led him to win the Faculty Citation Award in 1981, the first faculty member from the music department to receive this award.

He was a graduate of Wheaton College and Chicago's Conservatory of Music. He had hoped to study further in Paris under conductor and teacher Nadia Boulanger, but Robert took the opportunity to teach choir in Hawaii at the Honolulu Bible Training Institute instead. Robert and his wife Helen lived there for 15 years.

During those years, Robert superintended the school, directed the Honolulu Junior Symphony, and played first violin with the Honolulu Symphony and in the Liebrecht Chamber Music Series.

One of Robert's hobbies was tuning pianos. For 20 years, during the holiday season, he traveled to South America to tune mission church pianos. Robert tuned pianos in many different places, including Bible institutes, missionary radio stations (Trans World Radio), and in studios and homes. He also started a piano technology course at Moody to pass on his skills to students.
